## ADD A TOUCH OF FALL TO YOUR HOME WITH MASON JAR CRAFTS

If you're looking for a unique and creative way to show your love for fall, look no further than fall mason jar crafts. Simple mason jars can be transformed into fall decorations for your home. Plus, they make the perfect homemade gift. Enjoy this list of easy DIY and fun fall mason jar crafts:

### Autumn Leaf Mason Jar Candle Holder

Using an adhesive, such as Mod Podge, glue fake or real fall leaves to the inside of the mason jar. You can tie corn husks or twine around the top of the jar for a rustic touch. Place tealights inside for a fall-inspired glow.

### Mason Jar Fall Luminary



You can light up your home with mason jar fall luminaries. Using adhesive vinyl, cut out a maple leaf shape. Stick it on the mason jar and paint the entire mason jar in fall colors. Let the paint dry and remove the cutout. Tie some twine around the jar and add a tealight. Make multiple mason jars in different colors to create the perfect center fall centerpiece.

### Canning Lid Pumpkin



Once you've used the jars for the fall mason jar crafts, you'll still have leftover lids and bands. You can spray paint the canning lid rings pumpkin orange, other fall colors or just leave them plain. Once the rings are dry, string them on a piece of yarn or twine, tie a double knot, and space them out. Place a cinnamon stick in the middle for a stem, and you're done.
